Policy Documentation

- Proposals are made using wording supplied by proposers
- The RIPE community comments on this during Policy Development Process (PDP)
- The resulting RIPE policy documentation is based on the agreed wording



Current Situation

- Current IPv4 document (ripe-424) has had its 'core' text since 2002
 - Updated 6 times since then
 - Only for the bits relating to proposals
- Current IPv6 document (ripe-421) has had its 'core' text since 2002
 - Updated 3 times since then
 - Only for the bits relating to proposals
- Similar situation for ASN document (ripe-389)
- The flow and structure is interrupted
- Comments received recently



Question

- Is it necessary to clean up the language of these RIPE Documents?
 - Only language will be under surgery, not the meaning
 - NO policy change is intended
 - Only the regional RIPE policy documents



If yes...

- Should the RIPE NCC draft a revised version and publish for comments?
- Can mark changes vs current document
 - Same formatting used during PDP
- Would rather phase
 - First IPv4 document, then IPv6 etc etc...
- Care for
 - Concurrent proposals effecting the document under surgery
